### **How does Naturethon work in brief?**

### Become a champion, register your group!

Follow a few simple steps to register your group to the <u>1st event</u>. Not part of a group? Don't worry! Ad hoc groups will be formed during the training sessions.

### **Enroll in supporting activities**

Attend the scheduled training activities. Three meetings with experts and facilitators are planned to provide participants with basic knowledge of NBS while also helping groups develop their ideas.

### **Engage in dialogue**

Encourage your community to discuss and design effective NBS in your local area, thus helping shape the vision of a greener, more resilient, and more inclusive future.

#### Submit your idea

At the end of the initiative (December 1st), groups will share their ideas with the Naturethon team. Choose your preferred format: text, drawing, video, or any other creative medium.

#### And then?

At the end of the process, the representatives of the three proposals that stood out for their innovation, feasibility, and social and environmental impact will be hosted by the project at the next Finance Innovation Festival in Brussels (February 3-5, 2026). There, they will have the opportunity to present the key points of their proposal to an audience of international professionals.

The challenges that climate change imposes on communities require a complex effort that includes the ability and responsibility to engage all stakeholders with the common goal of finding effective and equitable solutions together. The European Climate Adaptation Platform Climate-ADAPT provides useful materials to support engaged citizens and local authorities in facilitating adaptation processes. The first edition of Naturethon proved how much creativity and commitment citizens can bring to the table. Across Europe and beyond, participants translated their ideas into actionable proposals for more resilient territories.

### Valencia NBS team (Spain)

Their project on long term flood resilience was recognized, integrating green infrastructure and risk analysis to strengthen urban adaptation. Thanks to its concrete approach and the support of

### **Nigerian farmers project (Nigeria)**

Awarded for promoting regenerative agriculture and food security. By introducing nitrogen-fixing crops, the project aims to restore soil fertility, reduce

a rich amount of data, the work was awarded for its consistency to the Naturethon goals. dependency on synthetic fertilizers, and improve farmers' livelihoods.

### "Os rapazes do Mathos" (Portugal)

Their work focused on restoring the coastal ecosystem of Matosinhos, removing cement walkways, rebuilding dunes, and experimenting with innovative financing tools.

### **Green laboratory (Slovakia)**

A creative proposal from students and experts in Bratislava to test green roofs and vertical gardens, turning NbS into living laboratories with tangible community benefits.



## **Connected Urban Green Spaces in the Metropolitan Area of Milan**

Want to better understand what NbS is and how it works? And perhaps you're curious to discover how successful participatory projects help communities and regions become more resilient?

Adopting a network-based approach to nature-based solutions strengthens urban resilience by supporting climate adaptation and reducing disaster risks. In this talk, Andrea Staccione (Karlsruhe Institute of Technology) presents a case study of Milan, showing how interconnected green infrastructures can halve flood damages and reduce population exposure, offering urban planners clear guidance on where to prioritize future green investments and interventions.
