For DNV she collaborated with several Italian companies on EU Emissions Trading Scheme for the verification and validation of their Clean Development Mechanism projects portfolios (i.e. Enel, Eni, Endesa, Edison). Project's activities validated encompass landfill gas recovery, renewable energy, energy efficiency, gas flaring reduction in Morocco, Nigeria, Tanzania, Argentina, Philippines.

She's currently responsible of the Scientific Coordination of CMCC six Research Divisions supporting the efficient and effective implementation of planned research activities of the Center. She pursues her research interest on climate finance and project financing mechanisms and more particularly on the role of Public-Private Partnerships in financing the climate agenda.
